He is a graduate of the University of Kansas School of Architecture and received his Juris Doctor (JD) degree from the University of Missouri-Kansas City.

Over the past 14 years, he has worked with each of the company's 10 practice groups and all of its regional offices, finding solutions to a wide range of legal and business challenges. In his most recent role, Odum has managed a staff of eight lawyers responsible for contract negotiations and providing legal counsel for all Burns & McDonnell business units.
